William Hendricksen writes

- "...though it cannot be proved that this story formed an integral part of the Fourth Gospel, neither is it possible to establish the opposite with any degree of finality."

John, New Testament Commentary, vol. II, p. 35

Consider the grace of Jesus:

- He is patient (John 7:53-8:6a)
- He exposes the sinful condition of man (John 8:6b-9)

Deuteronomy 17:6-7

- "Whoever is deserving of death shall be put to death on the testimony of two or three witnesses; he shall not be put to death on the testimony of one witness. The hands of the witnesses shall be the first against him to put him to death, and afterward the hands of all the people. So you shall put away the evil from among you.

Consider the grace of Jesus:

- He is patient (John 7:53-8:6a)
- He exposes the sinful condition of man (John 8:6b-9)
- He offers forgiveness and mercy to sinners (John 8:10-11)

John 1:17

- For the law was given through Moses, *but* grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.

Romans 8:31-34

- What then shall we say to these things? If **God is for us**, who *can be* against us? He who **did not spare His own Son**, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give us all things? **Who shall bring a charge against God's elect?** *It is* God who justifies. **Who is he who condemns?** *It is* Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who **also makes intercession for us**.

Hebrews 2:17-18

- Therefore, in all things He had to be made like *His* brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things *pertaining* to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, He is able to aid those who are tempted.
